What did success look like in 2021?

- 4,392 Participants from St. Louis and across the country
- \$4,180,536 raised for cancer research (\$1,072 average per participant)
- 398 Incentive Level participants raising a total of \$2,628,463
- 55 community-minded Sponsors & Partners funding Pedal operations
- 15 new Adult Cancer Research projects launched with Pedal funds
- 4 new Pediatric Cancer Research projects launched with Pedal funds

SITEMAN CANCER CENTER

A Multi-Modal Single-Cell Approach to Developing Personalized Combinatorial Treatments for Glioblastoma

Goal: To identify and isolate the distinct cell populations that comprise individual glioblastoma tumors, test the drug sensitivities of each cell population, and identify effective drug combinations tailored to the unique composition of each tumor

Principal Investigator: Allegra Petti, PhD, BA

Characterizing cancer cell intrinsic and immunologic phenotypes of estrogen receptor positive and HER2 negative breast cancer resistant to endocrine therapy and CDK4/6 inhibitor

Goal: To develop biomarkers that predict a patient's response to CDK4/6 inhibitors, the newest drugs available in the clinic for patients with stage IV estrogen receptor positive and HER2 negative (ER+/HER2-) disease, and to identify drug targets in resistant tumors, to design better treatments for breast cancer patients

Principal Investigator: Cynthia Ma, MD, PhD

Chemerin's Role in the Tumor and Immune Microenvironments in Prostate Cancer

Goal: To explore how the protein chemerin works to treat prostate cancer that has spread into the bones, and to develop this into a treatment that can be used in the clinic

PKN1 as a Novel Therapeutic Target to Prevent and Treat Graft-versus-Host Disease

Goal: To determine how a certain protein, PKN1, in a bone marrow donor's immune cells causes graft-versus-host disease, and how inactivating this protein would allow the healthy immune cells to attack the patient's leukemia cells but not healthy organs

Principal Investigator: Jaebok Choi, PhD

Understanding Transcriptional and Epigenetic Regulation of Metastasis and Treatment Response in Head and Neck Cancer

Goal: To identify new therapies for head and neck cancers that may prevent metastasis and avoid mechanisms of treatment resistance

Principal Investigator: Sidharth Puram, MD, PhD

HPV genomic structural subtypes in oropharyngeal squamous cell carcinoma

Goal: To understand both how and why "high-risk HPV genomic structures" may be a useful biomarker of high-risk disease for HPV-associated oropharyngeal cancer and ultimately better identify the high versus low risk patients at the time of diagnosis

Principal Investigators: Jose Zevallos, MD, MPH and Jin Zhang, PhD

Identification of ubiquitin ligases and substrates specifically interacting with a new pancreatic cancer suppressor ABTB2

Goal: To further test the therapeutic efficacy of ABTB2-expressing virus in clinically relevant KPC mice and patient-derived xenograft mice toward the ultimate clinical trial in patients with pancreatic cancer and identify ABTB2-specific interacting partner protein for developing novel targeted therapies for pancreatic cancer

MRI augmented X-ray imaging-guided adaptive radiotherapy for pancreatic cancer (MAX-guided ART)

Goal: To take the lessons learned, tools and models available from MR-guided radiotherapy, an expensive tool that requires expertise not found in most clinics, and apply them to the more common X-ray guided radiotherapy to achieve effective treatment of pancreatic cancer in the standard clinic

Predicting head and neck cancer outcomes using partial epithelial-to-mesenchymal transition biomarker

Goal: To develop a reliable genomic test to guide treatment decision-making in oral cavity cancer patients across diverse socioeconomic and demographic groups

Targeting ATR in TP53-mutated AML/MDS

Goal: To test the therapeutic activity of drugs targeting the ATR gene in combination with drugs that inhibit DNA replication in TP53-mutated acute myeloid leukemia

Goal: To identify new personalized therapeutic approaches for rectal cancer that increase cancer-free survival and reduce treatment-related side effects

Evaluation of Single Fraction Accelerated Partial Breast Irradiation vs. Five Fraction Accelerated Partial Breast Irradiation for Low-risk Stage 0 and I Breast Carcinoma

Goal: To reduce the number of required post-lumpectomy radiation treatments for breast cancer patients by determining whether just one treatment of Accelerated Partial Breast Irradiation is as safe and effective as the five-treatment standard of care
